### DESCRIPTION

The Onji-Akiing (*From the Earth*) Cultural Summer Camp is a collaborative effort between the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission and the United States Department of Agriculture–Forest Service. The camp centers around the Medicine Wheel, addressing not only the physical but also the emotional, mental and spiritual aspects of adventure-based learning. Onji-Akiing promotes awareness of treaty rights and practices, strengthens relationships with the outdoors, and fosters natural resource careers infused with traditional ecological knowledge. The camp is for students entering 5-8<sup>th</sup> grade.

### RESPONSIBILITIES for the health of campers and staff of approx. 80 in total include:

- Camper health form review (including preliminary lice check)
- Identifying health needs for each camper
- Oversight and proper storage of medications and supplies
- Triage and assessment of injury and illness
- Over-the-counter and prescription medication administration
- Knowledge of public health disease management
- Overnight on-call hours
- Communication with parents
- Enjoy working and living in a camp environment
- Strong Communication Skills
- Work well with youth

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Registered Nursing License
- CPR/ First Aid certifications
- Valid Driver's License
- Previous experience working with youth preferred
- Knowledge and respect for Native American culture and perspectives

**Native American Preference:** Indian preference will be applied consistent with GLIFWC policies and the federal Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance Act (PL 93-638).
